“Refers to the status of a person with regard to the place of residence on the reference day in relation to the place of residence on the same date one year earlier at the provincial level. Persons who have not moved are referred to as **non-movers** and persons who have moved from one residence to another are referred to as **movers**. Movers include non-migrants and migrants. **Non-migrants** are persons who did move but remained in the same city, town, township, village or Indian reserve. **Migrants** include internal migrants, who moved to a different city, town, township, village or Indian reserve within Canada. **External migrants** include persons who lived outside Canada at the earlier reference date.”
